

Paving Paths with Love and Memory

Caples House Museum in Columbia City, Oregon is offering “Love and Memory Bricks” installed in pathways to commemorate weddings, anniversaries, family, friends, companies, teams, and special life events.

Caples House is a pioneer house museum owned and run by the Oregon State Society Daughters of the American Revolution (OSSDAR). Situated with an inspiring view of the Columbia River and Mount St. Helens, the house and grounds have seen a lot of history – from before log cabin days to housing the first doctor’s office in Columbia County. But history is not frozen in amber – every person who interacts with a place or community leaves an imprint of sorts – and the OSSDAR is honoring this fact with Love and Memory bricks.

The herb garden will be paved with Love Bricks commemorating weddings and anniversaries. A “Memory Walk” between the museum’s Tea Cottage and the Children’s Attic museum will be paved with Memory Bricks.
